Alberta	\$15.00 \$13.00 (under 18)	Effective Oct 2018.
British Columbia	\$16.75	Effective Jun. 2023. Tied to annual inflation rate
Manitoba	\$15.30	Effective Oct. 2023. Tied to annual inflation rate.
New Brunswick	\$14.75	Effective Apr. 2023.
Newfoundland & Labrador	\$15.00	Effective Oct. 2023.
Northwest Territories	\$16.05	Effective Sept. 2023. The minimum wage is adjusted annually using a formula based on the percentage change in the Yellowknife CPI and the percentage change in the average hourly wage in the NWT for the preceding calendar year.
Nova Scotia	\$15.00	Effective Oct. 2023. Beginning April 1, 2025, the minimum wage rate will be adjusted with inflation plus an additional 1% annually.
Nunavut	\$16.00	Effective Apr. 2020. The minimum wage is reviewed annually in April.
Ontario	\$16.55 \$15.60 (under 18)	Effective Oct. 2023. The student minimum wage rate applies to students under the age of 18, who work 28 hours a week or less when school is in session or work during a school break or summer holiday.
Prince Edward Island	\$15.00	Effective Oct. 2023.
Quebec	\$15.25	Effective May 2023.
Saskatchewan	\$14.00	On Oct. 1, 2024, it will increase to \$15 per hour.
Yukon	\$16.77	The minimum wage is adjusted on April 1 of each year relative to the Consumer Price Index.
